# KU History



**1905**

Founded as Bosung College, the first institution of higher education in Korea

Lee Yong-ik, also known as Chungbukgong, Treasurer of the Royal Household of the Korean Empire, established Bosung College, the predecessor of Korea University, with the mission, National Salvation through Education.



**1910**

Chundokyo led by Sohn Byeong-Hee assumes control of Bosung College

Many professors and students, including Sohn, dedicated themselves to the March 1st Movement.



**1932**

Choongang Foundation acquires Bosung College

Kim Sung-Soo took a leading role in acquiring the crisis-stricken college and improving its educational conditions dramatically.



**1934**

Bosung relocates to Anam Campus

Driven by national aspirations, the Main Hall was constructed in Anam-dong.

In 1937, the Main Library was constructed on the basis of nationwide public subscriptions during the Japanese occupation.



**1946**

Korea University, an overarching name

On August 15, permission was granted for Bosung College's elevation to the status of a university and its renaming as Korea University.



**1960**

KU students spark the April 19 Revolution Spirit

On April 18, more than 3,000 KU students marched in protest against the injustice of the autocratic regime, thereby becoming the vanguard of the April 19 Revolution.



**1971**

Launch of the Medical School

KU acquired Woosuk University, incorporating its College of Medicine and affiliated hospital.

Through launching its medical school, KU added the spirit of philanthropy to its ideals.



**1980**

Opening of Sejong Campus

The campus in Jochiwon received accreditation in January, opening a new horizon for the university.



**1991**

Establishment of the Green Campus

The College of Medicine and its affiliated hospitals relocated to Anam-dong.



**2002**

Foundation set to enter the world's top 100 universities

The centennial anniversary project bore its first fruit with the transformation of the main athletic field into the Central Plaza.



**2005**

The Centennial Anniversary Celebration marks KU's rise from the national to the global level

KU's Centennial was celebrated in 2005.

### School Motto

The school motto announced in celebration of KU's 50th anniversary represents the realization of human liberty (LIBERTAS), the pursuit of justice (JUSTITIA) in society, and an overflowing passion for the search for truth (VERITAS).

Intellectuals activated with a passionate heart, not numb and engrossed in texts, are KU's everlasting value; this ideal is what makes KU people true to themselves.



### KU Tree

The Korean pine which represents fidelity and integrity, perfectly expresses KU's staunch desire to serve as a cradle for talented people.

### KU's School Song

KU's school song, heard at nine every morning resounding from the clock tower of the College of Liberal Arts building, was composed to celebrate KU's 50th anniversary in May 1955. The lyrics were written by Cho Ji-hoon, a member of the famous coterie of poets called the Blue-Green Party and a KU professor at that time. The poet was also well known for the poem Seungmu (Buddhist Dance) in which every verse contained liberty, justice and truth, the three words representing KU's spirit. The music was composed by Yun Isang, a promising young composer at that time.

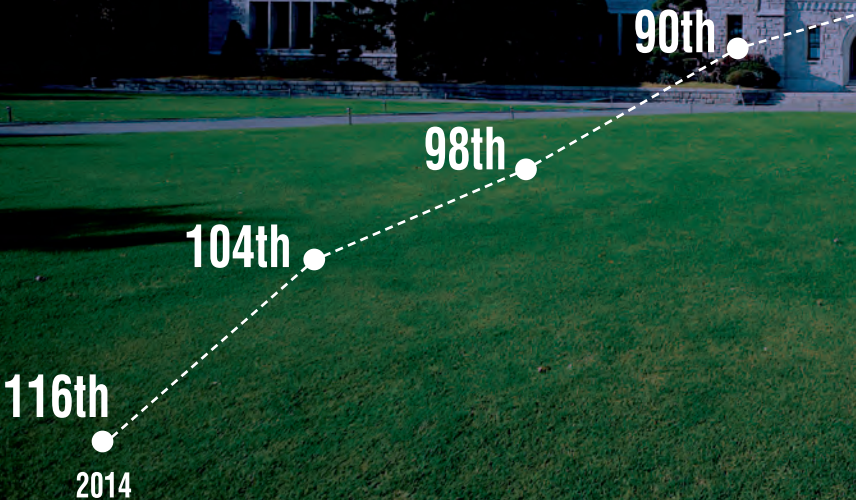

Korea University ranked 74th in the world in the 2021 QS World University Rankings conducted by Quacquarelli Symonds (QS), a UK university evaluation institution.

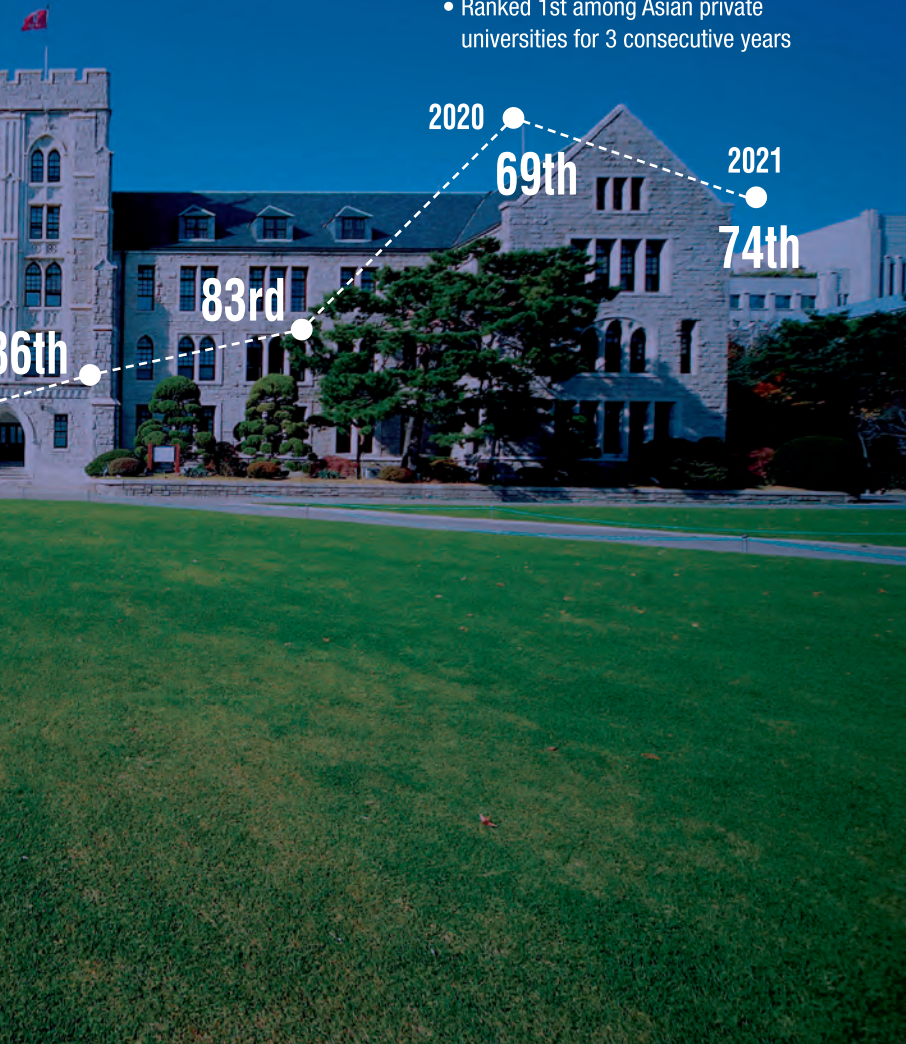

# KU Educational Infrastructure



## World's Best Educational Environment / Upholding KU Student Wishes and Visions

Having optimal infrastructure to support talented faculty and students is as important as attracting them in the first place. Outstanding students are fostered in the world's finest educational environment to become future leaders for Korea and the world.



### Library

Opening its doors in 1937, the Main Library currently consist of seven halls and buildings, including the Main Library (Graduate School Building), that are organically interconnected. Housing over 3.6 million books, KU's library is considered to have one of the finest collections affiliated with a private educational institution in Korea. Based on more than 670,000 digital items, the library provides state-of-the-art services such as an RFID-based book control system, mobile applications, and a Scholarly Information Curation Service (SICS). This vast intellectual resource is deemed the heart of human knowledge, underpinning studies and research conducted by KU students.

KU recently opened the C, D, and L lounges in the Centennial Digital Library to reflect the current trend in learning. Open libraries have been installed around the campus in an effort to continuously propel its transformation to user-centered learning and cultural spaces.

To further foster creative and proactive talent destined to actively contribute to the production and restructuring of knowledge beyond merely consuming it, KU opened the CJ Creator Library (CCL) comprising studios, editing rooms, event halls, and rest areas.





#### — LG-POSCO Business Hall

This cutting-edge building was completed on a 14,121m<sup>2</sup> site with KRW 25 billion in funds donated by corporations and alumni. Incorporating the best features of similar facilities at Harvard, Stanford, and the University of California, Berkeley, it is one of the world's premier business administration complexes.



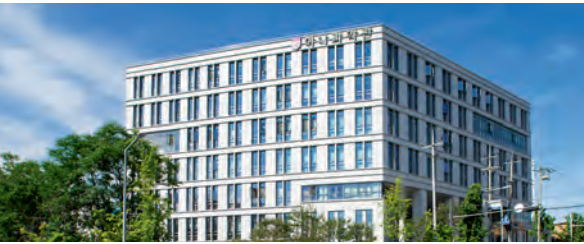
#### — Centennial Memorial Samsung Hall

Built in commemoration of KU's centennial, the Centennial Memorial Samsung Hall has a digital library to accommodate student requirements in the 21st century and a museum housing valuable cultural treasures. The building was designed under the theme of encompassing the past and future through its inspirational appearance.



#### — SK Future Hall

SK Future Hall is a future-oriented building that has two basement levels and is five stories high. With 106 labs and group-study rooms and 113 private carrels, the hall allows students to engage in open-ended discussions and private study depending on their requirements. In addition, cutting-edge technologies such as IoT and block chain, which are in operation in the building, manage the room reservation, entrance, and occupancy control systems, thus making the building a hub of the Smart Campus.



#### — Hana Science Hall

This science research facility of 32,044m<sup>2</sup> accommodates a number of research fellows and research labs with state-of-the-art equipment, supporting a wide range of scientific research and providing a steppingstone for KU to become a leading institution in the field of science.



### — CJ Creator Library (CCL)

Located in the basement of Central Plaza, CJ Creator Library (CCL) is a highly-appreciated venue where students are nurtured as intellectuals with creativity and activeness and encouraged to produce and reconstruct knowledge. Unlike traditional libraries, CCL consists of studios, editing rooms, event halls, and rest areas.



### — π-Ville 99

Open to anyone currently enrolled as a KU student, π-Ville has 15 studio spaces which are available to students free of charge. Those with creative ideas and passion can use the studios when preparing their own start-ups, planning volunteer work, or when developing art projects. Its auditorium, Idea Café, and 3D-printer Open Lab are also fully available to students who want to widen their conceptual and intellectual horizons and maximize their potential.



### — Anam International House

Korea University created a dormitory with a total of 197 rooms, to serve the rapidly increasing number of international students and help them concentrate on their studies. Anam International House has family rooms (8 in total) for international student family members visiting Korea University. Anam International House, a small society within the university, offers space for students to eat, sleep, enjoy life, and be together.



### — The Korean Language Education Center

The Korean Language Education Center, a four-story building with a basement floor, is a dedicated Korean language center, offering the optimal learning facilities and the best educational environment to students. Its club rooms and auditorium are spaces where users can share and experience a variety of languages and cultures.



### — Mediheal Earth and Environmental Sciences (EES) Hall

Mediheal EES Hall, a seven-story building with a basement floor, has cutting-edge research labs and facilities which are used for various strands of research on the temporal and spatial dimensions of the environment. With the aim of examining recent changes in the global climate and of helping to sustain and rehabilitate where necessary the global environment in the future, the building is available to those who conduct research in basic science and the environment.

# Global KU

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## Nurturing Global Leaders Backed by KU History

In today's international era, KU is emerging as a leading global university that nurtures globally-minded professionals who can contribute new knowledge to humankind. The KU tradition, passed down over the previous century, will serve as a solid foundation in forging students' characters and abilities, thus amplifying the international recognition of the university.

## The Cradle of Global Leaders

At KU, which has joined hands with 1,115 universities and institutes in 99 countries, world renowned scholars offer lectures. KU also offers the largest international summer campus in Korea. Students benefit from an exchange program in Paris and internships at the UN and the OECD. This is KU and KU connects to the wider world.





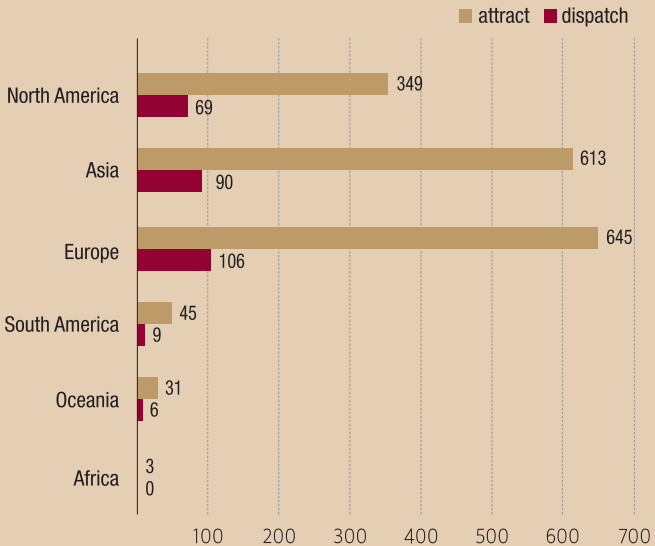
## Training Programs for Regional/Language Professionals Equipped with Global Leadership Skills

KU-Global Leadership Program (GLP), one of the special programs that the university offers, focuses on short-term language learning and cultural education. The program's curriculum encompasses training at home and abroad, which allows program participants to enhance their language skills efficiently during the 7- or 8-week long program. At the same time, they can promote their understanding of countries they visit by participating in various program activities, including special lectures given by professionals, cultural activities, and visits to companies. The program grants a scholarship to each participant, which covers the school expenses at educational institutions abroad and accommodation fees. A minimum of three to a maximum of six credits earned from the program are recognized as credits earned from summer/winter classes, the number of credits varying depending on which program a participant has joined. In the past eight years Korea University has launched a succession of Global Leadership Programs (GLPs). The KU-China GLP was launched in 2013, the KU-Latin America GLP in 2016, the KU-Japan GLP in 2017, and the KU-Germany GLP in 2019. Finally, in 2020, the KU-France GLP and the e-GLP, which mainly focuses on self-directed learning and intellectual exploration in the pandemic era, were launched. All GLP programs are offered during summer and winter vacations.

## Global Exploration and Research Program Focusing on Self-directed Study and Cultural Experiences

The KU-Global Exploration and Research Program is a short-term field trip program through which participants are given a chance to select overseas sites that are relevant to their research projects and visit them for about a week. Since the first exploration and research program offered in Vladivostok in 2016, the university has run the program in Shenzhen, China, Silicon Valley in the US, and Lillehammer in Norway. The program allows participants to develop their global leadership skills by visiting overseas sites and learning about their cultural, historical, and economic significance.

# Nurturing Global Leaders Backed by KU History

## — ISEP with 300 Prestigious Schools Worldwide

The International Student Exchange Program (ISEP) is a study-abroad program in which 300 member institutions in 50 countries including the US participate. Korea University, one of the select number of member universities in Korea, offers its students an opportunity to gain invaluable experiences with students from around the world through the ISEP Program.

## — Overseas Internship Program

The Overseas Internship Program of Korea University offers various overseas internship opportunities to KU students who have displayed outstanding performance in collaboration with the government, international organizations, non-profit organizations, and private companies. Students who are selected as program participants can begin to form the mindset of global leaders and broaden their perspectives, ultimately preparing themselves for the challenges that lie ahead in society.

## — College of Liberal Arts 7+1 Program

Students who enter the departments affiliated with the Division of International Languages and Literature may choose to study abroad for a semester in a country whose native language is that of the students' major. Learning a foreign language and body of literature, which is regarded as an essential tool in an era of globalization, in the country where the language is broadly spoken helps the 7+1 program participants enhance their foreign language competencies to a level of near-native fluency. Living in a foreign country also helps the participants better understand its culture and history.

## — International Summer/Winter Campus

Korea University's International Summer/Winter Campus is a short-term international program offered during summer and winter vacations, and is the largest of its kind in Korea. Fully taught in English, the program includes world-class lectures by professors from global universities, offers a variety of opportunities for participants to communicate with students from over 300 universities across the world, and incorporates unique Korean cultural experience programs, all of which help the program participants to grow their competencies with regard to becoming future global leaders.

## — KU's Online Learning Program, a New Paradigm for Global Education in Overcoming the Barriers of Time and Space

To overcome the barriers of time and space between different countries and universities, Korea University has established an online learning program which allows the sharing and exchange of tertiary educational materials. Utilizing the global network of Korea University, students can listen to lectures provided by the world's most prominent universities and communicate with students from other countries without any physical constraints.

## — KUBA & KUISA, Buddy Programs Connecting International and KU Students

Korea University Buddy Assistants (KUBA) and Korea University International Students' Assistants (KUISA) are the university's one-on-one partnering programs designed to help international students studying at Korea University assimilate to university life. KU students participating in the KUBA and KUISA programs provide support for international students in their efforts to settle in Korea. The range of their support includes helping with class registration and domestic travel, and organizing the university's festival for international students, which all add up to the establishment of long-lasting friendships.

### Annual Ko-Yon-Jeon (the Korea-Yonsei Games), Competition and Friendship that Lead Korea

### Great Granite Tower Festival, Festival of Resurgent Youth

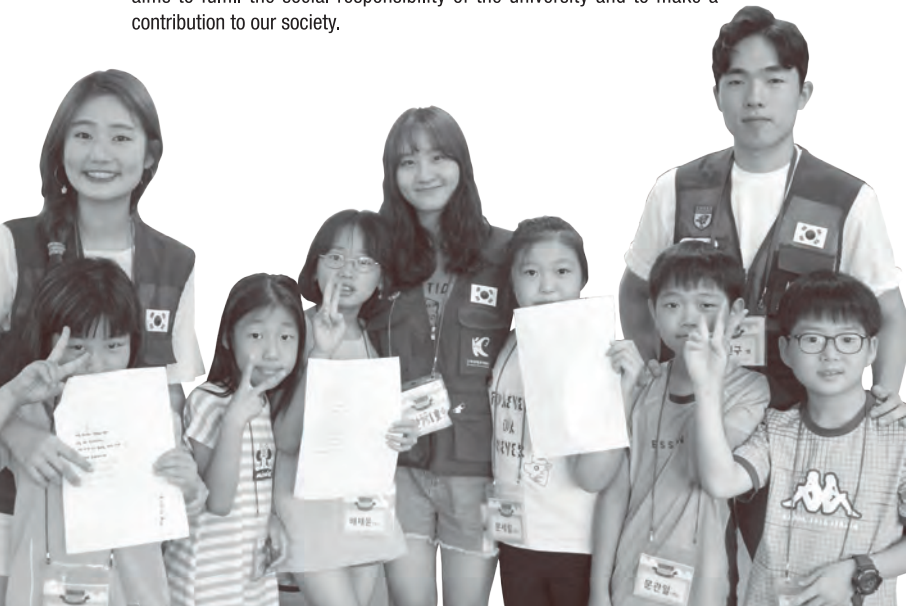

The cheering of Ipselenti which is the most passionate and popular event, academic seminars which give rise to sharp analysis and discussion, joint broadcasting events with Yonsei University and street events on Chamsari Street are ongoing all week.

Since its launch in October 2008, KUSSO has been working vigorously to practice noblesse oblige under the motto of Intellectuals to take action, leaders to think, a university to serve society. ## Club Activities to Support Dreams, Love, and Romance

Student club activities are often considered the gem of campus life. Joining others who share similar hobbies, talents, and interests and growing together are among the prime joys of KU life. There are over 150 clubs in Seoul and Sejong campuses. These include approximately 80 clubs under the Seoul Campus Club Association, which focus on society, social sciences, life and culture, language studies, exhibitions and creative art, instrumental music art, performance art, religion, and sports, and around 20 clubs under the Aegineung Club Association, which are related to society and religion, scientific research, culture and sports, and performance art.



## KU Paper, KTN, KUBS, Exemplars of the 21st Century Media

The KU Paper, the first Korean university newspaper launched in 1947, is delivered to KU students every Monday and features on- and off-campus news analyzed with sharp perceptiveness. KUBS, launched in 1961, is the on-campus broadcasting system which gives a platform to students' voices. It produces regular audio and internet content. Launched in 1997 as the first campus TV station, KTN broadcasts news and more for 24 hours a day through an on-campus CATV network and the Internet.



## Student Ambassador Yeoul, KU Pride in Action

Yeoul, KU's student ambassador team, was launched in 1998 to help spread the word about KU. Yeoul, meaning Let KU flow, expresses the pride of student ambassadors. Serving as the face of KU through their love for and pride in the school, Yeoul not only serves visitors on campus but also goes off campus to run a variety of PR programs.

## Business School

### — The Top Business School in Korea Goes Global

KU Business School (KUBS), which began life as the Department of Plutology in 1905, was the first of its kind in Korea. Since its establishment at Bosung College, the Business School has continuously played a leading role in Korean history.

Based on its vision of entering the world's top 30 business schools and becoming the foremost such school in Asia by 2030, KU Business School has continued its research exchange programs with top global universities based on the research capabilities of its faculty, the largest in Korea. KUBS has attracted attention from many students because of its exchange student program, global internship program, and startup station. The school has its own scholarship programs, the 'KUBS Scholarship', which pays a certain portion of individual student tuition, and the 'KUBS Dream Scholarship', which financially supports students with their living expenses so that they can concentrate on their studies without financial constraints. In addition, KU Business School boasts three Concentration Tracks—Business Analytics, Social Value & Sustainability in Business, and Entrepreneurship and Innovation—to respond to changes in society and nurture creative convergence talent among the future leaders of society.

The world-renowned business education alliances AACSB and EFMD Global have accredited KUBS as a world-class higher education institution. In 2005, KUBS became the first Korean institution to have its undergraduate school, graduate school, and MBA program accredited by AACSB, followed by reaccreditation in 2010, 2015, and 2020. In other words, since 2005 KUBS has successfully achieved five-year accreditation four consecutive times. In 2007, it gained EFMD Quality Improvement System (EQUIS) accreditation, also a first in Korea, followed by reaccreditation in 2010, 2015 and 2021. CEMS, the Global Alliance in Management Education, ratified KUBS as Korea's representative business school in 2015. This made KUBS Korea's only full-fledged member of the alliance, as it is an exclusive group of academic and corporate member organizations to which only the best business school in each nation is granted membership.

KUBS' MS and PhD programs aim to nurture researchers by providing them with the latest knowledge in their field and by guiding them towards excellent research performance by offering comprehensive business administration courses. Based on its curriculum, which reflects the most current business theories and the most up-to-date information on practical developments, the school sends students with superior capabilities to world-class universities in other countries, thereby propelling them towards the realization of their professional goals. Selected as a member of a large education research group focused on business in the humanities for the 'Brain Korea 21 FOUR' university support project run by the Ministry of Education, KUBS receives subsidies from the Ministry. Since 2020, these government subsidies have been used to provide various scholarship benefits to students pursuing their masters or doctoral degrees for seven consecutive years. In addition, in 2020 in order to meet the ever-changing needs of the times, KUBS launched a one-year MS program in Business Analytics, the first of its kind in Korea.

The results of assessments of other colleges conducted at home and abroad attest that KUBS is Korea's leading business school, having remained at the top of Hankyung Business' Korean Business School rankings for 13 consecutive years. In the 2021 QS World University Rankings, published by Quacquarelli Symonds, Korea University was ranked 48th in Business & Management and 57st in Accounting & Finance. The school achieved a remarkable ranking in the U.S. News & World Report's 2022 Best Global Universities for Economics and Business, outperforming other Korean universities with its rank of 19th among universities in Asia.

In the following year, those three departments started to accept new students, a period which is regarded as the beginning of the College of Science at Korea University. Recently, basic science has grown in importance with accelerating speed. The principles of nature, understood through basic science research, are being swiftly applied to changing the world and creating vast amounts of wealth. The engine behind phenomenal scientific developments such as smart phones, and dramatic improvements in areas such as cancer survival rates, is the research conducted in the field of basic science. If we aspire to achieve a better future, this hope is rooted in basic science.

In order to work toward the future prosperity of mankind and the affluence of society, the College of Science has been carrying out adventurous experiments with endless curiosity and a passion to explore natural phenomena. Since 1999, the College has received government subsidies as part of the Brain Korea 21 program led by the Ministry of Education. The College of Science has affiliated research institutes, including the Institute of Basic Science established in 1971, which support the college's reputation as the foremost in Korea for science education and research. The Korea Basic Science Institute Seoul Center, located next to the College of Science Building, aids greatly in industry-university research collaborations and basic and applied research conducted by the College of Science.

### — Cultivating creative and excellent global engineers through differentiated engineering education

Established in 1963 with the aim of nurturing creative and excellent global engineering leaders, the College of Engineering boasts more than 200 outstanding faculty members committed to research. The college has grown into a world-class university with over 5,000 students in nine departments/divisions, including the Department of Semiconductor Engineering and the Department of Integrative Energy Engineering established in 2021.

The College of Engineering established in 1996 for the first time in Korea the Korea Techno Complex, a large-scale research complex, to promote research cooperation between academia and industry. Designated by the government as a graduate school-led institution of higher education, the college has been selected as a member of the BK21 PLUS project, through which it receives government subsidies that allow it to offer scholarship benefits to students.

In 2021, the College of Engineering was selected as a host university in the field of the new energy industry in the Innovation Sharing University Project for Nurturing Digital Technology Talents by the Ministry of Education. In this project, the college develops a shared education program and platform required in the era of great energy and digital transformation as part of industry-linked convergence education for students. The results of this development will be disclosed to the general public and industry in the future, laying the foundation for leading education in related fields.

And in 2022, the College of Engineering and LG Energy Solution will jointly establish the Department of Battery-Smart Factory, a contracted program under the Department of Materials Science and Engineering, to nurture the next generation of global talent in the battery sector, which is considered the "second semiconductor."

Based on the principles of liberty, justice, and truth, the College of Medicine aims to nurture doctors who protect the sanctity of life and promote health with a mature sense of ethics, medical professionals who provide optimal treatment to patients and conduct insightful research, and leaders who are equipped with a sense of global citizenship and contribute to the development of healthcare.

The college has had landmark achievements in medical research such as the discovery of the causative agent of Hemorrhagic Fever and the development of the first vaccine for the ailment. It also played a key role in the establishment of Korea's first forensic medicine research center. In addition, both Anam and Guro hospitals were selected as national research hospitals. The college was also selected as a BK21 PLUS project partner and as a participant in the national strategic precision medicine project. All of these achievements have contributed to positioning the college and its medical center as a research-oriented medical college that is highly respected both at home and abroad.

In addition, the college has incorporated more variety and initiative-centered elements into its curriculum with the aim of fostering talented students with interdisciplinary knowledge and the leadership skills required in the era of the 4th Industrial Revolution. Along with the curriculum, which organically links basic medical sciences with clinical medicine, the college offers its students a variety of opportunities to go abroad in order to engage in medical volunteering, to join student forums, and to exchange clinical training experiences with students at other universities. All of these innovations have enabled the college to become a leader in medical education in Korea. Furthermore, the college is a member of Universitas21 (U21), a global network of research universities, and Korea's only member of the Global Alliance for Medical Excellence (GAME), through which eight member universities focus on medical education and research. In meeting the expectations that membership in the alliance brings, the college is committed to the establishment of global standards for medical education and the promotion of interdisciplinary research in medicine, leading to a new paradigm in medical education.

As of February 2020, the medical school had trained about 8,000 medical personnel who provide medical treatment to patients with devotion and care wherever their medical expertise is needed.

With the aim of training software professionals who have global competitiveness and creativity, the College of Informatics was established in 2014 by combining the Division of Computer Communication Engineering at the College of Information and Communication with the Department of Computer Education at the College of Education.

The College of Informatics began as a single department, the Department of Computer Science and Engineering, and subsequently grew through the amalgamation of various university departments. It began teaching freshmen in March 2015, and has now become the largest software-focused college of any major university in Korea. To accommodate the rapidly growing need for data-driven technologies throughout the IT industry, the college inaugurated the Department of Data Science in March 2021. In living up to the college's reputation, respected faculty and the highest quality students have been working diligently to maintain high standards of excellence in the teaching and learning of software development.

In recent years, the college has been selected to participate in large-scale government projects and major projects led by respected research foundations. By participating in joint research projects with private companies, the college has been contributing to the technological development of those companies. By increasing the number of lectures delivered in English, it aims to take its educational offering to the next level and become a leader in the global digital industry. In addition, the college has been striving to equip students with practical knowledge and skills by offering new majors and programs, including the Software Technology & Entrepreneurship Program, Interdisciplinary Major in Brain and Cognitive Sciences, Interdisciplinary Major in Information Security Convergence, and Interdisciplinary Major in Artificial Intelligence.

By nurturing talented students through a focus on creative thinking and global competitiveness in the software industry, and by training researchers who can accommodate the needs of industry, the College is seeking to enter the world's top 50 universities in the field of computer science by 2030. Thanks to its continuous efforts and commitment to educational innovation, it has solidly positioned itself as a research-focused college which is at the forefront of developments in the software industry in Korea and in the world.

Since its foundation in 2002, the Division of International Studies has been dedicated to cultivating global leaders. The faculty, comprised of 21 full-time professors, visiting professors and part-time lecturers, is unmatched, receiving the highest Social Science Citation Index (SSCI) scores and the highest scores in relation to internal lecture evaluations. According to a global university ranking published in July 2012 by Quacquarelli Symonds (QS), a British higher education evaluation agency, the division ranked 1st in Korea and 26th in the world in the field of international studies. In a 2014 university ranking released by the U.S. News & Report, a prestigious American media company renowned for its university evaluations, the division took second place among universities in Korea. These accomplishments solidify its reputation as a top-tier private educational institution in Korea.

If education in international studies has focused on developing language proficiency and interdisciplinary studies on cultivating a global mindset, the next generation of international studies should aim to foster professionals with a strategic mindset who are fluent in second and even third languages and equipped with problem-solving capabilities to grapple with topics ranging from climate change and terrorism to multinational corporations.

To achieve its goal, the Division of International Studies has designed its curriculum to add expertise in the following five fields; international development and cooperation, international commerce, international security and peace, regional studies, and Korean studies. To provide practical opportunities, it also established close cooperation with external organizations. In 2010, the division invited the UNDP Seoul Policy Center, part of the UN global network, to establish an office in the KU International Studies Hall. In 2014, it jointly established the KU-KIEP-SBS EU Centre with KIEP and SBS. It hosts the English Debate Championship and the Model UN Competition as extracurricular student club activities, both of which generate some of the most outstanding and productive debates in Korea. Furthermore, in collaboration with international organizations, the division offers a variety of overseas internship opportunities, helping equip its graduates with the knowledge and experience necessary for working at international organizations in the future.

## School of Psychology

### — The Center of Interdisciplinary Education for the Knowledge-based Society of the Future

In 2021, the Department of Psychology at Korea University decided to expand into a school, the first department of its type to do so in Korea. In 1959, the Educational Psychology Department opened its doors to students, and in 1962, the Department of Psychology was split off from it, becoming an independent department which has continued to develop up to the present. Currently, the school has approximately 500 undergraduates and 200 graduate students and post-doctoral researchers. The school teaches basic and applied psychology, including behavioral and cognitive neuroscience, cultural and social psychology, consumer and advertising psychology, and clinical and counseling psychology.

It offers curriculums that foster interdisciplinary education and research by encompassing strands of natural science, social science, and the humanities. The undergraduate and graduate courses lead to different degrees based on the subjects students have studied and the courses they have completed. Specifically, undergraduate students may be eligible for either a Bachelor of Arts or a Bachelor of Science degree, while graduate students may be eligible for either a Master of Arts or a Master of Science degree. In addition, the school employs innovative education modules which focus on social issues, and puts great emphasis on practical education, in this way nurturing experts in the field with problem-solving abilities based on creative thinking.

The school has three affiliated research centers: Behavioral Science Research Center, Wisdom Science Center, and KU Mind Health Institute. It was recently selected as a member of the BK21 FOUR project group supported by the Ministry of Education. As a result, the school has been carrying out research to identify psychological solutions to ills that are standing in the way of the sustainable development of society. Thanks to its educational and research achievements, the school is highly respected at home and abroad. In 2016, it was ranked highly in a university ranking released by JoongAng Daily, and in 2020, it outperformed other psychology departments in Korea in the Times Higher Education World University Rankings by Subject.

## College of Public Policy

### — Providing Theoretical Knowledge and Practical Experience to Future Policy Experts in Government and Public Institutions

The College of Public Policy is composed of Division of Public Administration, the Division of Public Sociology and Korean Unification/Diplomacy, the Division of Economics and Statistics, and Division of Big Data Science. With the relocation of various central government offices and national research institutions to Sejong, the city has become the key hub of the formulation of public policies, leading to a demand for more research and education in this area. In response to such needs, departments in the fields of social science and public policy under the aegis of the college have been integrated in order to form the new college.

The Division of Public Administration aims to cultivate people of talent with outstanding capabilities in analyzing policies and efficiently managing organizations within local governments and national administrative agencies. It provides a practical education in close collaboration with government agencies. The division offers its students opportunities to visit various departments at Government Complex Sejong, where they can gain hands-on experience and analyze real-world administrative operations, thereby developing problem-solving abilities. The Division of Public Sociology and Korean Unification/Diplomacy offers education to develop the ability to critically evaluate various policies from the perspective of the public interest and suggest new alternatives on the theoretical basis of sociology. It is also specialized in unification diplomacy and diplomatic security studies, primarily through the prism of inter-Korean relations. Its educational and research focus is the social development and diplomatic security policies of Korea. The Division of Economics and Statistics, which combines the study of economics and statistics, teaches students how to analyze the economy on the basis of statistical tools and how to derive the statistical results required for economic analysis. The aim is for this knowledge of economics and statistics to become a foundation for the formulation of more optimal public policies. Lastly, the Division of Big Data Science nurtures data scientists who will lead the era of the 4th Industrial Revolution, that is human resources with expertise in big data analysis using statistics-based machine learning and artificial intelligence.

At the College of Public Policy, students have an opportunity to explore five different majors offered by four divisions and to choose an additional major which is related to their future career, while completing the coursework for their first major. Graduates may decide to work for government, public, or research institutions, financial institutions, or private enterprises, or they may gain admission to graduate school in order to develop more expertise in their field.

The Division of Smart Cities will provide students with living lab, self-directed, problem-solving, and open programs, so that they can play a leading role in reorganizing the global industrial structure of smart cities.

- The Graduate School of Public Administration aims to cultivate not only scholars who focus on theoretical research, but also elite professional public servants equipped with the ability to solve various public issues through policies based on a solid understanding of government policies and the latest administrative theories. To this end, the graduate school offers specialized educational programs that help develop normative and practical policy design capabilities and scientific analysis skills related to public administration and public management.

The Graduate School of Public Administration is composed of the Department of Public Administration and the Department of Public Policy, and each department has doctoral and master's degree programs. In 2021, of a total of 50 applicants for the graduate school's doctoral and master's degree programs, 33 were admitted (7 for doctoral programs and 26 for the master's programs). Notably, 22 of the 33 successful applicants were actually serving in the government agencies, public institutions, or military agencies, such as the Office for Government Policy Coordination, the Ministry of Patriots and Veterans Affairs, the Ministry of Personnel Management, the Ministry of Food and Drug Safety, Anti-Corruption & Civil Rights Commission, the Ministry of Education, the Ministry of Science and ICT, the Ministry of the Interior and Safety, the Ministry of Land, Infrastructure and Transport, Military Manpower Administration, Korean National Police Agency, Korea Consumer Agency, Korea Human Resource Development Institute for Health & Welfare, and Logistics Command.

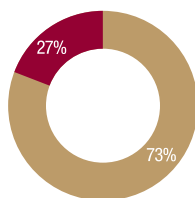

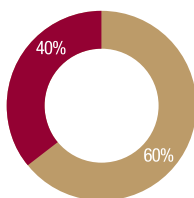
Percentages of Current Students by Gender



Percentage of Students on a Leave of Absence by Gender

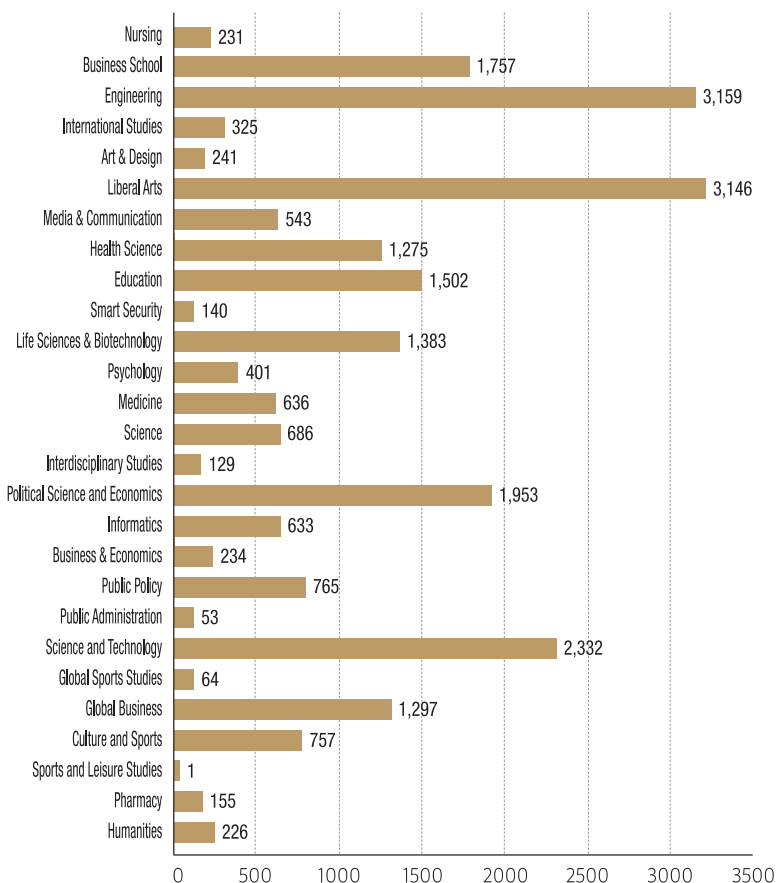


Percentage of Enrolled Students by Gender

## Current Undergraduate Student Body by College (as of October 1, 2021)



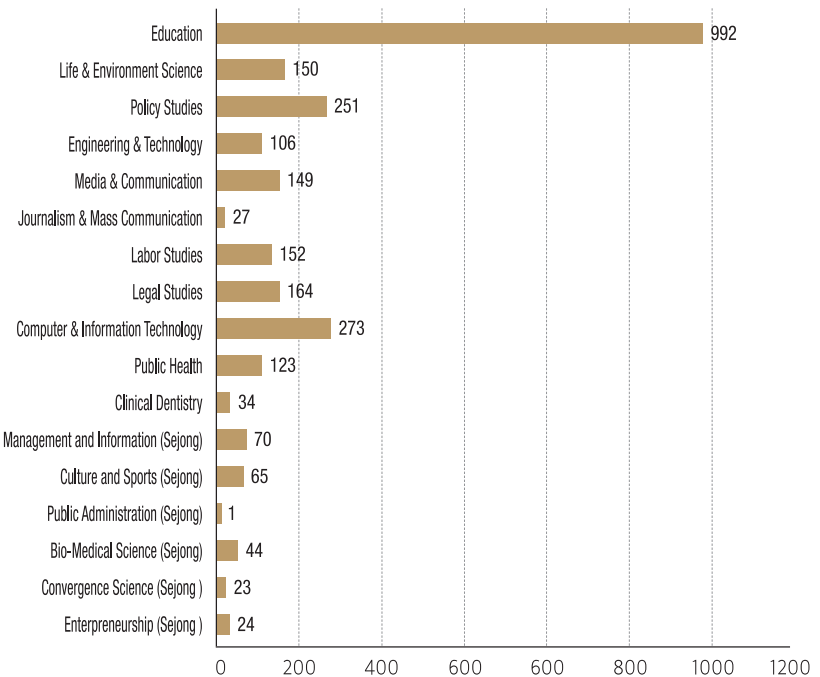

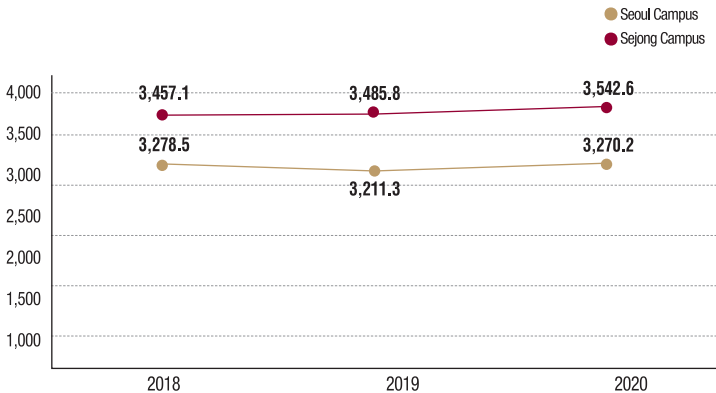
